

About Bellevue Christian School

Bellevue Christian School (BCS), founded in 1950, is an independent nondenominational Christian school committed to providing a Christ-centered education. Serving over 900 students on three campuses located in Medina, Clyde Hill, and Woodinville, BCS offers a comprehensive curriculum grounded in a biblical worldview from preschool to 12th grade.

MACK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Mack Elementary is a school that draws from the close-in region. Most families come from Woodinville, north Kirkland, or Bothell area. There are many families at Mack with one stay-at-home parent. Volunteerism is high, as well as time spent on the playground after school while parents chat. Racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic diversity is lower than at other BCS campuses. Parents desire a collaborative and relational leadership style from the principal.

THREE POINTS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Three Points Elementary is a school that draws from a wide geographic area. Families come from as far as 25-30 miles away. Many families are two-parent working families. They desire out-of-school hours for parent meetings and volunteer projects. They value afterschool care and enrichment opportunities. There is racial and ethnic diversity at Three Points as well as a small group of international students.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

Each academic discipline is approached with the goal of developing skills that can be used in God's service and deepening the understanding of both God and oneself. In essence, students are guided to develop a biblical worldview within every subject. Recognizing that learning and doing are inseparable, BCS offers numerous opportunities for students to serve, share, create, and produce using their God-given talents. As a result, students are thoroughly equipped for the next steps in college and vocational life.



Relationship

Reflecting God's love in every interaction and communication.

- Teaching is modeling. Faculty and staff at BCS model the life-giving relationships that reflect the nature of God's kingdom with mentorship playing a vital role.
- Academic instruction is delivered in the context of relationships. Faculty and staff know and care deeply for each student.
- "Iron sharpens iron." Peer to peer encouragement and support foster a healthy environment for growth and resilience.

Academic instruction at BCS is most effective within the context of meaningful relationships. Faculty and staff are committed to knowing and loving their students, modeling the kinds of relationships that reflect the nature of God's kingdom. Mentorship is highly valued, both between teachers and students and among peers. Through intentional guidance and support, faculty and staff help students bridge the gap between who they are now and who God is calling them to become.

Discipleship

Cultivating Christian practices that produce growth, maturity, and virtue.

- Worship is essential to understanding our identity. Students engage in prayer, singing, Bible study, chapel, and fasting. Academic, athletic, and artistic efforts are also viewed as acts of worship.
- Acts of service connect growing skills, Christian character, and life faith into a purposeful calling, following Jesus' example of servant leadership.
- BCS partners wholeheartedly with parents and churches to minister to the whole child.



At its core, BCS believes that the ultimate aim of education is discipleship. This foundational belief drives the school to explore and answer life's essential questions: Who are we? Why are we here? What is our purpose? Discipleship is the process through which biblical worldview, character formation, and academic development converge into a lifelong calling—one that carries both present impact and eternal significance.

School Distinctives

- A low student-to-teacher ratio ensures personalized attention and support.
- Differentiated instruction meets the needs of both advanced and developing learners, with pull-out instruction offered in Advanced Math.
- The arts are celebrated with specialist instruction offered in choir, band, and fine art.
- Skills classes in PE, technology, and library are offered weekly.
- Our Teaching for Transformation framework helps children find their identity in God's story by weaving together our academic knowledge with spiritual growth and character through acts of engagement and service in our communities.
- The Bible is studied as an academic subject, as well as used in class devotional times.
- Chapel meets weekly.
- Our elementary school has a full-time counselor offering guidance and support to both children and parents.

- We are trusted to do our jobs.
- We have a culture of fun; we care deeply for each other and have a good time—are supportive.
- There is a strong sense of community; day by day interaction is welcomed—it is not cliquish.
- We have great community support.
- I love that I can incorporate faith into math.
- We use 'love and logic' to equip/empower students to make decisions versus making them for them.
- We make the invisible God visible through words, actions, and excellence.
- Faith is naturally woven in—BSC is intentional about pointing families to Jesus.
- Though we are a bible-based school, we integrate faith into secular curriculums.
- We are realistic about academics—great faith integration.
- By and large, families want to be involved and included.
- It is awesome to walk alongside students and their families, often for their entire school career.

- Provide students in a well-rounded, Christ-centered education.
- Develop and oversee academic programs that integrate a biblical worldview with academic excellence.
- Address and resolve concerns fairly and respectfully.
- Foster a welcoming and professional school environment through collaboration, communication, and service.
- Manage timely submission of reports and compliance documentation.
- Participate in student recruitment, admissions, and promotional efforts.
- Ensure efficient scheduling of classes, staff, and resources to maximize student learning outcomes.
- Maintain student records and update the student handbook as needed.
- Implement a consistent, mission-aligned discipline system.
- Develop and manage the annual budget.

FACULTY LEADERSHIP

- Recruit, supervise and evaluate faculty, ensuring alignment with the school's education and spiritual mission.
- Lead faculty and staff meetings, ensuring clear communication and goal alignment.
- Collaborate with the leadership team on curriculum development, policy updates, and professional development.

- Possess proven leadership skills and a commitment to growing as a servant-leader, building a high-performing team.
- Be an effective communicator who can motivate others, manage change, and clearly convey the school's mission and vision.
- Exhibit strong organizational skills, with the ability to set priorities and manage multiple projects simultaneously.
- Experience reporting to a Board is preferred.
- Demonstrate an ability to plan, set priorities, and implement work in a disciplined manner, keeping multiple projects progressing to completion simultaneously with minimal direction.
- Balance "big picture" thinking with attention to detail.
- Possess excellent written, verbal, and interpersonal communication skills.
- Be skilled in strategic management, program development, and evaluation.
- Experience reporting to a Board is preferred.
- Have an understanding of educational regulations.
